HOW DOES ALTERNATIVE YOTE

The proposed new election system is called 'Alternative vote'. It gives you a chance to rank the candidates in order of preference. You can write numbers next to each candidate to show your first choice, second choice etc. You can rank as many candidates as you like, or just write


